



PGY2 Oncology/Hematology requirements for successful completion of the University of Louisville pharmacy residency program 2020-2021

Career Goal:

To create pharmacists with ability to function independently as oncology pharmacy specialists in practice settings including adult hospital oncology services, ambulatory care oncology and clinical faculty appointments.

Requirements for the residency year:

The resident will be required to have the following 1 month rotations: a minimum of 2 months of acute Care Hematology/Oncology, 2 months of inpatient bone marrow transplant, 2 months of ambulatory care solid tumor clinic, 1 month of outpatient bone marrow transplant clinic, 1 month of informatics, longitudinal oncology clinic (1 day / week for 10 months), longitudinal service (208 hours ~26, 8-hour shifts), longitudinal administration, longitudinal drug information, and longitudinal research (1 completed research project with national meeting poster presentation and manuscript submitted for publication). The ultimate goal is to develop the resident's skills as a clinical pharmacist in the area of hematology and oncology. The resident is required to achieve $\geq 80\%$ of all RLS outcomes, goals and objectives as well as 80% (11 objectives of competency area 1) and does not have any active NIs in order to successfully to complete the residency.

Activities (common to all experiences)

1. Patient Care

- a. Attend daily rounds
- b. Monitor drug therapy on all patients in service, make appropriate recommendations, pharmacokinetic monitoring and supportive care
- c. Have direct interaction with patients through medication histories, allergy update, immunization screening and medication counseling.
- d. Participate in MUE, ADR and medication error reporting
- e. Provide drug information to health care professionals
- f. Present and discuss patient care issues with the preceptor
- g. Participate in clinical research projects and drug study implementation

2. Meetings

- a. Multidisciplinary hematology/oncology conference every Friday
- b. Oncology M&M every Friday



- c. Pharmacy Journal Club attendance every other Thursday
- d. Cancer Care (C2) Conference first and third Wednesday monthly
- e. Attend quarterly oncology P & T subcommittee meetings
- f. Attend ASHP MCM and participate in PPS (optional)
- g. Attend HOPA meeting
- h. Attend Great Lakes Regional Conference (optional)

3. Teaching

- a. Primary preceptor of students and PGY1 residents during repeat learning experiences
- b. Provide **one didactic lecture** in an academic setting
- c. Provide **one nursing** and **one medical in-service** while on **most rotational** experiences
- d. Participate in **one community service program**
- e. Provide **one, 1-hour ACPE approved continuing education** to pharmacy department
- f. Provide **five, 1-hour oncology pharmacy cancer conference presentations**

4. Residency Activities

- a. Coordinate **one resident-led longitudinal activity (resident job)**
- b. Attend required resident social events
- c. Complete **one research project**
- d. Complete **one quality improvement project**
- e. Prepare and present **two P & T monograph or drug class review**
- f. Prepare and present **either one new policy/procedure or two antineoplastic policy/procedure review/updates**
